

Follow-up After Emergency Department Visit for Substance Use (FUA)

- **Description:** The percentage of emergency department (ED) visits among members 13 years of age and older with a principal diagnosis of substance use disorder (SUD), or any diagnosis of drug overdose, for which there was a follow-up visit or a pharmacotherapy dispensing event.
- Two rates reported: Follow up within 30 days and follow up within 7 days.
- Exclude ED visits that result in an inpatient stay or ED visits followed by residential treatment on the date of the ED visit or within the 30 days after the ED visit.



KEYS TO SUCCESS:

- **Schedule patients within 7 days from an ED visit. Patient need to be seen within 30 days.**
- **Bill with a mental health diagnosis**
- **Utilize telehealth when appropriate**
- **Provide patients with resources, education and referrals as a appropriate**
